

What If I am Already Licensed or Certified in Another State?

Out of state lead contractors who want to work in Connecticut must apply for a Lead Contractor's License.

If you are applying for a lead certificate: Your experience or training may help you qualify for a lead certificate.

What Training is Required?

Licenses: No training is required.

Certificates

- A training course is required for each certificate.
- A refresher training course is required for certificate renewal.
- The application and renewal forms explain the required training.

What Training Courses Should I Take?

The Applications and Examinations Section approves lead training courses and keeps a list of them.

Call or write the Applications and Examinations Section to ask for a list of the approved courses and how to sign up for one.

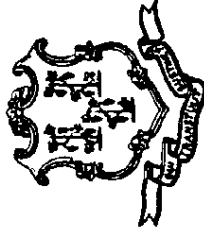

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What is Lead Abatement?

Lead abatement is the removal, replacement and/or encapsulation of lead paint in and around homes* and day care centers.

* Homes with children under age six.

Why Are Licenses and Certificates Required?

To help ensure that lead abatement is done safely.

- Careful abatement is important for the health of children.

What Does the License Cost?

The application fee for a lead contractors license is \$500.00. This fee is not refundable.

Who Needs to be Licensed?

Every business and person who contracts to:

- Abate lead in and around homes* or day care centers;

- Inspect for lead in and around homes* or day care centers;

- Assess the risk from lead in and around homes* or day care centers;

- Develop plans to abate lead in and around homes* or day care centers.

* Homes with children under age six.

What Does a Certificate Cost?

The application fee for each lead certificate is \$25.00. Each certificate expires on the last day of the individual's birth month. Renewal cost is \$25.00.

Who Needs to be Certified?

People working in and around homes* or day care centers who:

- Oversee lead abatement (lead abatement supervisors);

- Abate lead (lead abatement workers);

- Inspect for lead (lead inspectors);

- Assess the risk from lead (inspector risk assessors);

- Develop plans to abate lead (lead planner-project designers).

* Homes with children under age six.

What is the License Called?

A Lead Contractor's license.
